There have been several favorable comments on the columns appearing last year under the heading of What's in the Library. The Editor would gladly include more of these in the newsletter if more were available. So put your mind and fingers to work and submit a column for inclusion in future issues.

Proposed amendments to Bylaws

The following amendments are designed to add the Second Vice President to the officers authorized to sign checks on Clayton Friends bank accounts. The Friends bank accounts are set up to require two signatures on all checks. Normally the President and the Treasurer are the ones who sign and the present Bylaws allow the First Vice President to sign in the absence of either the President or the Treasurer.

With the officers living in widely separated parts of the city it has at times been inconvenient or impossible to get the necessary signatures in a timely fashion. Authorizing the Second Vice President to sign in the absence of the First Vice President would make it easier to get the checks signed. The checks would still require two signatures with at most one substitute for the the President and the Treasurer.

The text of the proposed amendment follows. The changes have been reviewed and endorsed by the Constitution and Bylaws Committee. Additions are <u>underlined</u> and deletions are enclosed in brackets, [delete: -----].

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

Section 7.3: (Paragraph 2) The Second Vice President shall perform any duties as assigned by the President, the Executive Board, or the Membership. In the absence of the First Vice President, the Second Vice President shall act in that capacity. The Second Vice President shall be authorized to cosign checks in the absence of the First Vice President.

Section 7.5: (Paragraph 6) The outgoing Treasurer shall be responsible for seeing that the incoming Treasurer, President, [delete: and] First Vice President and Second Vice President are authorized to sign checks on all Friends bank accounts.

Foreign Acquisitions Committee - P. R. Mommessin

The following major areas of activity are proposed for the Committee:

- 1. Provide assistance by suggesting titles of genealogical materials from foriegn sources for evaluation by Library staff. Identify names and addresses of suppliers of such materials if they are deemed suitable for purchase.
- 2. Contact potential donors of foreign materials and funds to be earmarked for these acquisitions.
- 3. Provide assistance to the Library staff in translating and interpreting documents of foreign origin.
- (1) Foreign materials of interest have been defined by the Houston Public Library Coordinator of Material Selection. They are "abstracts of records such as church, wills and probates, land records, monumental (e.g. cemetry) inscriptions, regional (county, shire, province) histories and lineage. General histories, esoteric historical materials, personal narratives or textbooks are not being sought." Friends who have a knowlege of or who would like to participate in this program should come forward. The activity will be intense

initially but would probably taper off after the major acquisitions have been proposed.

- (2) At least three major sources of materials and funds come to mind. (a) National governmental offices: Consulates, Cultural attache offices. (b) Major companies who have offices in Houston and also strong ties with a foriegn country. (c) Ethnic or National Societies, particulary those with a strong cultural rather than social commitment.
- (3) Assistance to the Library and staff can take several forms. Among them are the following: (a) Preparation of a "How to" book describing information available in foreign countries and providing a step by step explanation of how to request this material. Friends with experience in this are invited to participate in this project. (b) An extension of the "How to" book consisting of short explanations (in English) to assist readers of books written in foreign languages. (c) Provide assistance to the Library staff in the translation and interpretation of foreign documents.

Past activities of the committee include the following: A "How to" book by Elizabeth W. Kennedy "Researching in the British Isles."

"Some Suggested Additions for the German Genealogical Collection at Clayton Genealogical Library" prepared by Ms D. Yates. It will be transmitted to the Library for evaluation.

A list of French genealogical books submitted to the Library staff for consideration. Several of these books have been ordered by the Library after staff evaluation.
