PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What has Clayton Library Friends done for you lately?

Have you ever wondered if there is something **YOU** can do that will make a difference in the library?

Clayton Library Friends has opportunities for every member to offer support and skills for the betterment of Clayton Library.

There are opportunities to share your skills by volunteering to take a two-hour shift as a Greeter at the Clayton House or upstairs in the Microprint area. There is always plenty of training and backup, so you wond be stuck out there without an answer for a patron.

Those books that are on the carts dond just magically appear back on the shelves; volunteers are used to reshelf books. The training for this position might even help you to understand how books are filed and how to locate materials when you are doing your own research.

If you dond feel qualified to do one of those two activities you can volunteer to bring refreshments to the four general meetings.

There are often special projects that need to be done: data entry, a periodic shelf checking of the books, as well as a few data entry needs. Pat Metcalfe can always use help handling and organizing the donated-duplicate books that are housed upstairs at Clayton House until she is able to sell them for additional CLF funds.

How are we using your membership money? Clayton Library Friends was fortunate enough to have a large donation placed in an Condowment+ (that means we cannot spend any of the principal) we only have access to the interest generated from that money. We try very hard not to use any more of that interest than is necessary and still support the needs of the Library adequately. One example is the quantity of new materials acquired for Clayton. CLF has spent about \$40,000 a year on acquisitions. We also supplement the expenses for the library staff to attend national conferences and training so they have additional knowledge to help us with our research problems.

CLF hosts quarterly meetings for the members to hear a genealogical speaker present a program on some aspect of research. Last year all

four of our meetings were centered around educating us on the use and interpretation of DNA. This year we are trying to center our presentations around little-known materials already held in our own library.

With our spiffy new website, we are trying to become a general clearinghouse for the announcements of all genealogy organizations in the area. This will give patrons one place to find out what is going on in the area that might be useful in their own personal research. Our website also now has a list of new materials that CLF has purchased for the library and that are available for your use. If you havend researched in a geographic area for the past two years you will be amazed at how many new books we have that might give you answers to your research questions.

Hello Everyone,

Welcome to the New Year where almost the first quarter is already gone! Wow! Our days at the library have been filled recently with new researchers discovering family history in many ways - including DNA tests; listening to family stories; or driven by a family history legend waiting to be discovered.

Of course our **%**egular customers+ who have been visiting for many years are smiling faces that make the library feel like part of a lot of families. We have spent years together; making discoveries, sharing stories, life events, and becoming familiar throughout the years. This year marks my 13th at Clayton in August.

Common to all our customers is discovering documents answering specific questions. Many of these documents have other pieces of information that donq catch our eye at the moment. Focusing on the quest is common, then putting aside that document, moving on to another quest is usually the next step.

This is your reminder to take those documents you have, or go beyond the initial focus on the answer to the question in a new discovery and look at ALL the information. Even just a quick look might jog the memory in the future when an applicable question occurs.

Death certificates / information can be great to observe what might be a pattern of death. I recently noticed that my paternal grandmothersqdeath certificate listed cause of death, which turns out to be common when looking at other certificates. In speaking to a colleague, he mentioned to me his common information on a couple of his family death certificates was listed as **%** illed by a train.!!!!

Not to make light of the colleaguesqfamily cause of death, it is my hope that you find plenty of new information full of new discoveries, both ones that answer an immediate question and one that can help in the future.

Visit us at the library, all of us really enjoy working with you! It is our goal to help you find those documents and stories. Have a wonderful year searching . see you at the Library!

You've got your relative's skeleton consisting of dates and places. This talk will show you how to go about creating a newspaper clipping file on a relative to put flesh on that skeleton. We will explore newspapers in their original paper form, on microfilm, and electronic versions that can be found using the Clayton Library. Also explored will be the hundreds of newspaper indexes and % lipping+books at Clayton Library.

Irene Walters is one of the "Yankee Librarians" at Houston¢ Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research. She is originally from New York State and has her Master of Library Science degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Irene came to Clayton in September 1997 and currently, Irene is the cataloger for Clayton. She also coordinates Clayton¢ involvement in the digitization project with the LDS Library in Salt Lake City. Irene has given talks to many local groups on various aspects of genealogical research including, computers, the Internet, ancestors in the modern military, using newspapers for your research, New York State, Irish, and French research. Irene started her own genealogy research as a teenager and has taken her lines back into France and Ireland.



Thanks to CLF members, Pat Metcalfe and John Dorroh, CLF is once again being well represented at the National Genealogical Society (NGS) conference being held May 8-11, 2019 at St Charles, Missouri.

They not only showcase Clayton Library, Center for Genealogical Research (CL) as well as CLF by telling conference attendees about our group and our nationally recognized Clayton Library, but they also sell duplicate copies of genealogical resources at our booth in the exhibit hall to raise funds for CLF. Thanks to Pat and John for their dedication and passion and for helping to promote CLF and CL at these conferences. And also thanks to other CLF supporters who have helped to "man" CLF booths, which is a great way for volunteers to support CLF.





And, speaking of the NGS conference, CLF is so thrilled to announce that our own, Susan "Sue" Kaufman, manager of Clayton Library, was the much deserved, recent winner of the NGS Filby Award for Genealogical Leadership during the conference !!!! Aside from the tremendous honor associated with the award, Sue also received a \$1,000 prize. The award was presented to her during Librarians' Day, an event held each year during the conference. Created in 1999 by NGS, the award is named for the late P. William Filby, former director of the Maryland Historical Society. Filby was the author of many core genealogical reference tools that genealogists have utilized for decades.

Sue Kaufman has been the manager of the Clayton Library since 2005. Previously, she held positions as a genealogy librarian at the Peoria Public Library in Peoria, Illinois, and the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana. During her tenure, Clayton Library has become one of the finest genealogy libraries in the nation with some 100,000 research volumes, 3,000 periodical titles, and an extensive microfilm collection. It also is a FamilySearch affiliate library of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

Sue is a respected librarian, presenter, and administrator. She regularly lectures at community, statewide, and national events. She has served on the boards of many genealogical organizations, including the Texas State Genealogical Society (TxSGS) and the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS). During the nomination process, CLF Board members, patrons, colleagues, and volunteers submitted tributes that tell the story of a generous and skilled researcher who is always willing to help other family historians. **Congratulations to Sue Kaufman from Clayton Library Friends !!!**

Volunteers needed for a CLF Book-Acquisition-Team

The Clayton Library Friends operates as the support organization for the Houston Public Library Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research. A major way that CLF supports the library is by identifying and purchasing materials for the library collection.

The CLF Acquisitions Committee is looking for a few individuals who are willing to identify and do clerical work to acquire materials for the library. This committee will identify both United States and international resources. Training on the process/procedure of this activity will be provided. An informational meeting will be scheduled in the second quarter of 2019 to further explain the process. Commitment to the committee will probably begin in the fall of 2019.

The ideal person for this committee will be able to commit to spending time to help expend the funds that CLF budgets to the library for purchases. The time involved is probably about 10 hours a month, give or take some time, depending on how many members are on the committee. Ideally the committee should consist of 3-4 people. The materials are identified, clerical work is accomplished, and, prior to purchasing the list of titles, it is presented to the library collection development staff for approval.

More Volunteer Opportunities --

Are you looking for an opportunity to give back to the library that gives us so much? We can help you find a volunteer spot that fits your interests and schedule.

We hope you have been able to use some of the resources housed at Clayton Library to further your research this year. We also encourage you to support this wonderful library by volunteering in one or more of the following areas and projects that currently need your help.

Clayton House Welcome Desk

The Clayton Library is currently searching for volunteers to fill the Welcome Desk Assistant position at the Clayton House on Wednesdays 12 to 2 pm. Volunteers typically cover one 2-hour time block each week. The duties include greeting visitors, limited reference help, and assisting with microfilm readers and printers. Training is provided for all duties. Helpful skills would include general experience in genealogical research, basic computer skills, and familiarity with microfilm readers and printers.

Microprint Desk

We currently are looking for someone with a genealogy background to cover the 11am-3pm shift on the 2nd Saturday of the month.

Outreach Assistant

Outreach Assistants deliver brochures and promotional materials to neighborhood libraries, community centers, cultural organizations, etc. to help promote Clayton Library programs and services. Duties include identifying easily-accessible locations that have display racks for materials and a clientele that would likely be interested in learning more about genealogy, and dropping off brochures at these locations on either a one-time or ongoing basis. Training will be provided. Access to a vehicle may be required. Scheduling is very flexible.

Book Sale Assistant

Book Sale Assistants work with the Donated-Duplicate books that are temporarily stored at the Clayton House, and help list these books for inventory and inclusion in the Clayton Librarys book sale. Duties include sorting the books by state or geographic area on shelves, and using a laptop computer to enter book information into pre-set tables in a Word document. Training will be provided. Helpful skills include good visual acuity and attention to detail. Some bending, stooping, and light lifting may be required. This activity involves working on a laptop computer in the stacks at the Clayton House. Scheduling is flexible but subject to the days/times that the Clayton House is open. A commitment of 8 hours per month is requested.

Programming Researcher

Programming Researchers assist staff by researching, viewing, and evaluating online genealogy webinars for potential addition to Clayton Library programming and events schedules. Duties include searching for genealogy webinars on a given topic (suggested websites are provided by the Programming Supervisor, but you may discover others on your own), and viewing webinars and completing assessments (assessment forms provided by the Programming Supervisor). Training will be provided. Helpful skills include familiarity with internet research and using computer audio. This activity involves working on a computer either at home or at the library. Scheduling is very flexible. Commitment can be one-time or ongoing.

Periodicals Assistant

Periodicals Assistants help with organizing and labeling Clayton Librarys bound and unbound periodical collections to make these collections more visible and accessible to library patrons. This would be a good activity for someone who wants to become more familiar with genealogy periodicals, or who enjoys organizing. Duties include inspecting, labeling, organizing, and shifting periodicals, and working with periodicals on specific projects identified by the Periodicals Supervisor. Training will be provided. This activity involves working with periodicals in the stacks or in the compact shelving in the staff workroom. Scheduling is very flexible. A commitment of 8 hours per month is requested.
