We have just learned of the June 16, 2018 death of **Dickie Kent Warren**. CLF President in 2005 and 2006. His term of office coincided with the start of the CLF project of renovating the Clayton House, Guest House, and Carriage House. Dick joined the CLF Executive Board mid-year in 2003 to fill a vacancy left by a resignation. In 2004 he served as 1st Vice-President/Director of Programs, followed by his election the next year as CLF President.

Dick was a founding member of the Bay Area Genealogical Society (BAGS), as well as being a member of several other genealogical groups. He had a forty-five year professional career at NASA, the U.S. Air Force, and Boeing. He was involved with every manned space program from Project Mercury to the Space Station . a real <u>rocket</u> scientist.q

Did you know you can avoid tax on required minimum distributions?

After age 70½ you are typically required to withdraw money from your traditional retirement accounts and pay the resulting income tax bill. Volunteer Opportunities at Clayton Library --

Are you looking for an opportunity to give back to the library that gives us so much? We encourage you to support this wonderful library by volunteering in one or more of the following areas and projects.

Shelving Volunteer

The next Shelving Training Class for those interested in becoming volunteer shelvers will be held on Monday, August 26, 2019, 10:30 am . 12:30 pm. Please RSVP to Steven.Bychowski@houstontx.gov if interested in attending the training. The typical time commitment requested for shelving volunteers is a 2-hour shift one day per week.

Clayton House Welcome Desk

The duties include greeting visitors, limited reference help, and assisting with microfilm readers and printers. Training is provided for all duties. Helpful skills would include general experience in genealogical research, basic computer skills, and familiarity with microfilm readers and printers.

Microprint Desk

A genealogy background would be very helpful.

Outreach Assistant

Outreach Assistants deliver brochures and promotional materials to neighborhood libraries, community centers, cultural organizations, etc. to help promote Clayton Library programs and services. Duties include identifying easily-accessible locations that have display racks for materials and a clientele that would likely be interested in learning more about genealogy and dropping off brochures at these locations on either a one-time or ongoing basis. Training will be provided. Access to a vehicle may be required. Scheduling is very flexible.

Book Sale Assistant

Book Sale Assistants work with the Donated-Duplicate books that are temporarily stored at the Clayton House and help list these books for inventory and inclusion in the Clayton Library¢ book sale. Duties include sorting the books by state or geographic area on shelves and using a computer to enter book information into pre-set tables in a Word document. Training will be provided. Helpful skills include good visual acuity and attention to detail. Some bending, stooping, and light lifting may be required. This activity may involve working on a laptop computer in the stacks at the Clayton House. Scheduling is flexible but subject to the days/times that the Clayton House is open. A commitment of 8 hours per month is requested.

Periodicals Assistant

Periodicals Assistants help with organizing and labeling Clayton Library¢ bound and unbound periodical collections to make these collections more visible and accessible to library patrons. This would be a good activity for someone who wants to become more familiar with genealogy periodicals, or who enjoys organizing. Duties include inspecting, labeling, organizing, and shifting periodicals, and working with periodicals on specific projects identified by the Periodicals Supervisor. Training will be provided. Helpful skills include good visual acuity and attention to detail. Some bending, stooping, and light lifting may be required. This activity involves working with periodicals in the stacks or in the compact shelving in the staff workroom. Scheduling is very flexible. A commitment of 8 hours per month is requested.
