sites to find what antique postcard collecting is all about as well as antique postcards for sale on-line or finding postcard shows to attend in your area where millions of postcards are sold - EVERYTHNG has been depicted on antique postcards, and like photos, people saved them! There are printed as well as real photo postcards. Most of the dealers sort their postcards by places called VIEWS. You can ask each postcard dealer how they organize their postcards. There were postcard collectors, even at the turn of the century, and those people would advertise they collect postcards in newspapers and magazines from a place or subject, and wanting to exchange postcards with others. It was a national pastime to gather in parlors and show postcards on postcard viewers, a way to travel from your own living room and share that experience with others. Many postcard dealers, and those on eBay, also sell engravings and photographs of historic sites, places and events, etc. too.
